## Jeovani and friends are all smiles thanks to you



In 2013, when little Jeovani, Dieu and Steven suffered debilitating leg injuries from a bomb blast resulting in amputations, all three struggled to adapt to life with their disabilities.

Last year, Open Doors visited them to see how they were doing. Double-amputee, Jeovani, has made good progress, walking around using only one crutch. Dieu is doing well, running and even playing sports. Steven outgrew his prosthesis but has since received a replacement.

Our local co-worker reported after the visit that Jeovani, "was all smiles and very happy when we met him. He tells his friends that it's people abroad who care for him, showing them the cards and letters and images...." When our team asked Dieu how we can pray for him, he replied, "Please pray for my friends who help me (OD supporters); pray that God would bless them in return for their support." And our co-worker said, "Steven is always grateful and looks forward to every delivery, as it's an opportunity for him to show the cards to his friends. It's always a happy moment for him."

- When sending a video please send the text separately with any specific instructions as the video will be recreated into Arabic.

## Uplift Middle Eastern teenage boy Abdu

#### E-campaign ends 25 April '18

When Abdu (15) and his brother became Christians after their mother converted, they couldn't go to school because of their conversion. Abdu now lives without his family. He hasn't seen his mother in two years, after she went abroad to arrange a better future for them. His father is a drug user and dealer, so Abdu moved out. His biggest fear now is that he will lose the Christian family he is currently living with. *"I don't want to lose any more people. I really wouldn't know what to do. I still pray every day that God will reunite my family,"* said Abdu.

Content from teenagers would be welcomed most, as Abdu misses contact with his peers. Pray that God will strengthen Abdu during this difficult time in his life and will reunite his family.

#### Some ideas:

- Video of a teenager encouraging him directly.
- Video of you reading your favourite Bible verse.
- Video of a group of friends singing their favourite worship song.
- Pictures of cards made for him.
- Picture of a nicely handwritten prayer, or video of youth reading the prayer.
- Very short (100 words) reflection on a Bible passage.

Haoua is the mother of 12-year-old Kadidja who came to faith in Christ through Christian neighbours in 2016. Haoua became a Christian after seeing the love and support the church showed her daughter.

Last October, when Haoua took Kadidja, who had liver cirrhosis, to hospital, her two-year-old daughter died after a brief illness, while in the care of a relative. A month later, on 22 November, Kadidja passed away from liver cirrhosis. Haoua has two more children, Bouba (8) and Sule (6).

Write a letter of comfort and encouragement to Haoua as she mourns the loss of her two daughters. Pray that God will help her to remain steadfast in the faith.

## Encourage young bomb victims in Indonesia

## **INDONESIA**

#### Writing campaign ends 15 August '18



On 13 November 2016, after Sunday school in Samarinda, Indonesia, a man threw a cocktail bomb, which injured Anita (3), Alvaro (5), Trinity (4) and Intan (2). Intan passed away the day after the attack...

The other three children remain severely traumatised. And their families are struggling to rebuild their lives. Trinity and Alvaro, whose injuries are severe and complex, continue to undergo treatment. The scars on their faces, hands and legs have affected their self-image and personality. *"I am ashamed, my body is full of scars,"* said Alvaro. *"Trinity loses her temper easily after the blast,"* said her mother.

Anita, Alvaro, and Trinity need help to believe in God's beautiful plan for their lives. You can encourage them by writing them a card or letter. And by praying for them and their families.

Please address your cards to each child individually – Anita, Alvaro, or Trinity. If you are addressing the cards to their parents, please specify. Greeting cards, artwork by children, and postcards will be best.

The children's English is very limited. Visit **www.opendoors.org.za/write** to see some encouraging words in Bahasa Indonesian (the national language) that you can use for your cards and artwork.

## Strengthen burn victim Manda



### DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO Writing campaign ends 30 June '18

Manda (29), is a mother of four from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). She sustained severe burns to her body when her husband, angered over her rebirth in Christ, set her on fire.

Initially, her husband was happy with her decision and even considered joining her at her new church. But three months after her baptism, something changed. One day in May, he returned home drunk and while she was breastfeeding their youngest child, he poured petrol over them and set them on fire. The child did not survive, and Manda sustained terrible injuries that kept her in hospital for three months. She has no support from her family, but her church continues to stand with her. Because of her injuries, she is unable to work for long in the sun, making it hard to earn a living.

Strengthen Manda by writing her a letter of encouragement. Pray for strength and courage for Manda as she deals with the persecution and rejection.

## Some simple guidelines before you start writing

## **PRAY BEFORE YOU START**

Ask God to give you the right words to write. Include one or two Bible verses. For Bible verses in other languages, visit www.biblegateway.com.

### **SHOW SENSITIVITY**

Please do not dwell on the recipient's plight, or share about the blessings of life in your country.

## **KEEP IT SHORT AND SIMPLE**

Print clearly. Write in simple English or, if you can, in the recipient's language. Short letters cost less for us to post, and are easier to translate.

### SECURITY

Please <u>DO NOT MENTION OPEN DOORS</u> in your letters, criticise a country's religion or religious extremists, its government, judicial system or political leaders. It is fine to include your name and country, but NOT your full address.

## **CARDS AND POSTCARDS**

Colourful cards can say so much more than a long letter on plain paper. If you are writing a postcard, please send it in an envelope rather than writing Open Doors' address on the card. If you are sending more than one letter or card, please put all your letters in one envelope, addressed to: c/o Open Doors.

### HANDMADE CARDS AND ARTWORK

Making cards is a great way of helping younger people to connect with persecuted Christians.

## GIFTS

Please <u>DO NOT</u> include money in your letter or card as Open Doors will not be able to forward your gift. It is unsafe to do so and can cause difficulties for the recipient.

### **NORTH KOREA**

We regret we are unable to forward letters to believers in North Korea.

## RESPECT

When writing to those in Muslim countries, please do not say anything negative about Islam or make reference to Israel (<u>even when using scripture</u>). Remember to *continue praying* for the person you have written to as you post your cards and letters to: Letter Writing: Believer's Name, c/o Open Doors, PO Box 1771, Cresta, 2118.
