We were made for community - to be supported, mentored and discipled by other members of the body of Christ. Your support in 2017 helped teach thousands of Christian leaders how to equip believers facing difficult circumstances – like Seida\* in Sudan.

Seida left Islam many years ago to follow Christ. She married Peter, also a Christian. But when war broke out in 2011, he joined the army and was later killed.

Seida struggled to raise their children alone, and her family pressured her to return to Islam. Fortunately, Seida's church leaders were trained in how to support widows like her, and she received the support she needed. They even taught her embroidery, so she can earn a living for her family.

Seida shared...

"I am grateful to my church leaders who are always by my side. They are doing whatever they can to help me stand on my feet."

The reality is persecuted Christians need both spiritual and practical support - including financial and educational opportunities.

While some organisations distribute food and money - which helps only for the short term – you helped to assist families, widows and orphans with literacy training and jobs, so they can provide for themselves long term.

One such opportunity is a stone factory in Iraq that employs Christians fleeing persecution. The steady income means they can stay in Iraq, provide for their families again, and remain a witness.

One man employed by the factory shared...

# Your Cry Has Brought Hope for the Middle East

An incredible 808 172 people from 143 countries signed the Million Voices of Hope Petition. The petition forms part of one of Open Doors' global initiatives, Hope for the Middle East, that advocates for Christians in Iraq and Syria to have the right to equal citizenship, dignified living conditions, and a prominent role in reconciling and rebuilding society.

In December 2017, the petition was presented to highlevel United Nations officials, UK Prime Minister Theresa May, and USA Vice President Mike Pence, amongst others.

Thanks to your determination and the strength of our collective voice, our cry for hope in the Middle East has been heard!

The United States and the United Nations have jointly

pledged \$55 million (R761 million) to help Christians in Iraq rebuild! Doors have also been opened to continue meeting with high-level officials in the United Nations.

Fr Behnam is an Iraqi church leader who was part of the delegation that presented the petition. He shared of the three and a half years since the Hope for the Middle East campaign began...

"We discovered that the Church in all the world is with us. It is like St. Paul said in 1 Corinthians: when one suffers, all suffer; when one rejoices, all rejoice. I thank God we proved that Christians in all the world are one family because we have Christ – no matter our denomination."

Thank you for helping give Christians in Iraq and Syria hope and a future. And thanks to your continued gifts and prayers, this advocacy campaign continues.
