

In November 2016, Alvaro (5), Trinity (4), Anita (3) and Intan (2) were severely injured in a bomb attack at their church in Samarinda, Indonesia. Little Intan was the most severely injured and passed away a day after the attack...

Alvaro and Trinity suffered from severe burns because of the blast and are still undergoing treatment for their injuries in Malaysia and China respectively. Anita suffered from the least amount of physical injury but she has been suffering from severe psychological trauma – she meets with a counsellor twice a month and is progressing well.

Their parents are grateful for the help received from Open Doors and also for your words of encouragement. Alvaro's father simply said, *"Thank you so much for all of this."* While Trinity's mother said, *"God sends his Church to help us... I am very grateful that we experienced the love and prayers from Open Doors from the beginning."*




Newly-converted Boris needs words of hope

Boris (23), a brand-new follower of Christ, is facing much pressure from his fellow villagers in Central Asia. They are not happy that he converted to Christianity... Boris has already been beaten up twice and ended up in hospital. He now suffers from severe headaches, memory deterioration and has lost 60% of the hearing in his right ear. Sadly, he is also having difficulties obtaining work due to his memory deterioration. When he recently did get a job, he was unable to remember simple tasks and had to leave.

A unique chance to strengthen North Korean Christians!



In North Korea, Christianity is seen as a dangerous, foreign religion, which has to be viciously fought against. So, Christians have no room in North Korea and consequently must live their lives in utmost secrecy. Gathering in large groups is absolutely impossible for Christians. It is life-threatening to even just be recognised as a Christian.

You have a unique opportunity to encourage Christians in North Korea. We currently broadcast seven different radio programmes and we want to end each broadcast by reading a selection of encouraging messages from you.

It will make a massive difference to them. And please continue to pray for believers in North Korea – that God will make seeing eyes blind as they worship Him in secret.

Embolden pastors and their flocks to stand strong

In November of 2016 a revised peace agreement between the Colombian government of President Juan Manuel Santos and the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC-EP) was ratified by the Colombian Congress.

This peace agreement, however, has not necessarily brought respite from persecution to Christians targeted by the former FARC-EP... After the signing of the peace agreement, some from the FARC-EP, who were against the peace process, joined the National Liberation Army (ELN) in Colombia.

The ELN continues to fight against the Colombian army, and in the regions of Guaviare, Tibu, El Tarra, Tumaco and Arauca, an increase in violence has been noted. In light of these developments, we'd like to encourage pastors and their congregations who continue to work in these areas, despite the increased opposition.

So, we invite you to send words of encouragement to these pastors and their churches, letting them know that there are believers around the world standing in the gap for them. Pray for the Lord's protection over them and that, despite the increased danger, they will be a bold witness for Christ.

Some simple guidelines before you start writing

PRAY BEFORE YOU START

Ask God to give you the right words to write. Include one or two Bible verses. For Bible verses in other languages, visit www.biblegateway.com

SHOW SENSITIVITY

Please do not dwell on the recipient's plight, or share about the blessings of life in your country.

KEEP IT SHORT AND SIMPLE

Print clearly. Write in simple English or, if you can, in the recipient's language. Short letters cost less for us to post and are easier to translate.

SECURITY

Please DO NOT MENTION OPEN DOORS in your letters, criticise a country's religion or religious extremists, its government, judicial system or political leaders. It is fine to include your name and country, but NOT your full address.

CARDS AND POSTCARDS

Colourful cards can say so much more than a long letter on plain paper. If you are writing a postcard, please send it in an envelope rather than writing Open Doors' address on the card. If you are sending more than one letter or card, please put all your letters in **one** envelope, addressed to: c/o Open Doors.

HANDMADE CARDS AND ARTWORK

Making cards is a great way of helping younger people to connect with persecuted Christians.

Please DO NOT include money in your letter or card as Open Doors will not be able to forward your gift. It is unsafe to do so and can cause difficulties for the recipient.

NORTH KOREA

We regret we are unable to forward letters to believers in North Korea.

RESPECT

When writing to those in Muslim countries, please do NOT say anything negative about Islam or make references to Israel (even when using Scripture). Remember to *continue praying* for the person you have written to as you post your cards and letters to: Letter Writing: Believer's Name, c/o Open Doors, PO Box 1771, Cresta, 2118.
