Persecuted pastors in Central Asia

Central Asia is often a 'forgotten' region. But Christians in Central Asia have not forgotten Jesus. Pastor Alim's* church meets around a meal. Pastor Vasily* distributes Christian books. Brother Viktor* shares the Gospel – and Pastor Dimitry* simultaneously runs a church, a tile-making business and a hostel for the homeless and addicts. All these things are risky in Central Asian countries where believers face discrimination, arrest, imprisonment and even violence for their faith.

Pastor Alim says, "Open Doors helps us – not to avoid persecution – but to endure it, and to keep our hearts in peace and continue our ministry in spite of persecution. And this is important: not to keep someone from persecution, but to help them live through it."
