

YOUR SUPPORT HELPS US TO BE PRESENT FOR THE LONG TERM

In many of the closed countries where Christians are persecuted for their faith, community is very important for survival as people are dependent on one another for resources within those communities.

Being present in many of those persecuted Christians' lives is a long-term commitment as they have to rebuild their lives from scratch and, in some cases, are fighting drawn-out court cases. It can be very discouraging to face this alone.

For three years now Open Doors has been able to walk alongside a group of Christian families in Mexico after they were expelled from their ethnic communities because of their faith. "Open Doors has been a blessing for us since three years ago when our expulsion happened. We bless you all for supporting us," said one of the families.

YOUR ADVOCACY HELPED JUSTICE TO PREVAIL

In many countries, believers are persecuted by the government and their communities – but you generate campaigns to help expose religious oppression and related crimes.

You also advocated for believers like Leah* and Hubba* with urgently needed legal assistance to defend their freedom and faith.

Leah lives with her elderly husband and six children in rural northern Kenya. Her family is the only Christian family in their vicinity.

Last year Leah's teenage daughter, Hubba, was raped during an important Muslim celebration. Afterwards, community elders wanted Hubba to marry the perpetrator, but Leah refused.

Thanks to your support, the case was reported to the police, and the culprit was arrested. He is now awaiting trial. Open Doors has provided legal support and helped broker emotional support to Hubba, who is still on the road to recovery.

Many believers have to be discreet when they read their Bibles, while others are illiterate and are unable to read the Bible because of it.

In places like India, digital Bibles are helping believers in some of the most remote villages access the Word of God, and it has become a great encouragement to many of them. "These digital Bibles are encouraging believers to stand firm in their faith since there are several interesting videos and testimonies [on it]," shared Kadam*, a church leader in India.

Thanks to your support, even amid lockdowns believers could access God's Word safely through digital Bibles. Those who are illiterate are able to listen to the Word, and through it, be strengthened in their faith!



YOUR GIFT ENABLED DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING TO CONTINUE




YOUR SUPPORT ENSURED BELIEVERS COULD SURVIVE
