REMEMBERING BROTHER ANDREW

Brother Andrew was a little boy when he first heard the story of God's creation. But it was only when he was lying in a hospital bed, after being injured as a soldier, that the story didn't seem so far-fetched. And it was then that he wondered whether all that the Bible spoke about is true.

This excerpt from Brother Andrew's biography, *God's Smuggler*, captures that moment of truth:


Finally, one night, a fragile little event occurred that changed my life far more radically than the bullet that had torn through bone and muscle a year before. It was a stormy night in the dead of winter, 1950. The sleet blew... as it can only blow in Holland in mid-January... There were many voices in that wind.

What was I hanging on to? What was it that was hanging on to me? What was standing between me and freedom?

The rest of the house was asleep. I lay on my back with my hands under my head staring at the darkened ceiling, and all at once, very quietly, I let go of my ego. With a new note in the wind yelling at me not to be a fool, I turned myself over to God – lock, stock and adventure.

It truly was just the beginning of Brother Andrew's adventure...

Five years after this young Dutch missionary gave his life to Christ, Brother Andrew went, in 1955, with a Dutch



delegation to the World Youth Congress in Warsaw, Poland. There he discovered a remnant of the Body of Christ behind the Iron Curtain that was desperately in need of Bibles. Brother Andrew distributed a suitcase full of Christian literature. This marked the humble beginnings of Open Doors.

Brother Andrew's story told in *God's Smuggler*, an international bestseller, details dangerous border crossings, KGB pursuits, and his courageous journey toward living radically for Jesus Christ.

In 1993, Brother Andrew was knighted by Queen Beatrix of the Netherlands. In 1997, he was the recipient of the World Evangelical Fellowship Religious Liberty Award, recognising his lifetime of service to the persecuted Church and his passion for spreading the Gospel. However, Brother Andrew says he was most proud of being named a "Blood Brother" of the Apache Indian tribe in the 1980s. As part of the ceremony, he was given an Apache name that means "He who breaks through the lines."


One more honour that Brother Andrew was proud of came after the fall of the Iron Curtain, when he obtained copies of the KGB reports, numbering more than 150 pages, about his work in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe. He was surprised they knew so much about him yet couldn't stop his work.

Brother Andrew's work through Open Doors has brought the hope of the Gospel into places where most Christians are unwilling to go. His underground network of indigenous Christians in these high-risk areas has aided the secret distribution of millions of Bibles each year. And today, thanks to friends like you, Open Doors trains thousands of Christian pastors and lay leaders through seminaries and persecution seminars; and assists in

economic relief, literacy training and vocational training in the most dangerous countries in the world.


His friendships and the love of God have taken Brother Andrew into private meetings with numerous fundamentalist leaders from other religions. He's among the few Western leaders to have regularly gone to these groups as an ambassador for Christ. He has also broken through Christian religious barriers by preaching in Catholic and Coptic Orthodox churches.

Brother Andrew was married for 59 years to his wife Corry who passed away on 22 January 2018. They lived all their lives in Holland and are survived by their five children and eleven grandchildren. And, by courageously opening doors for God's Word through friends like you, their spiritual children here on earth and in heaven are countless!

BOLDLY LIVING OUT CHRIST'S LOVE

In the 1980s, Hezbollah, an Islamic political and militant group in Egypt, kidnapped and held hostage a relative of someone Brother Andrew knew. The hostage was chained to a radiator for three years.

While attempting to get him and other hostages released, Brother Andrew arranged a meeting with Hezbollah's sheikh and representative, Fadlallah. While Fadlallah didn't have the authority needed to release the hostages, he could deliver a message to Hezbollah's leaders.

So in advocating for the chained hostage to be released, Brother Andrew said, "I'm fully prepared to stay here and take the place of this man. He has suffered enough...." Surprised, the sheikh asked, "How can you say that?"

Brother Andrew responded, "This is the Spirit of Jesus." He stood and spread out his arms to demonstrate. "He died on the cross to let us go free. He died so we could live. Now I'm ready to give myself up so my friend can go free. This is what Christianity is all about."

Fadlallah had never heard of this kind of Christianity. Although Brother Andrew's request wasn't granted, they stayed in contact for several years before Fadlallah died in 2010. (Brother Andrew's selfless request made a powerful impact on all who heard about it, encouraging the hostages as he boldly lived out Christ's love in the face of danger.)

Brother Andrew celebrates his 90th birthday and takes a private trip to a country in South Asia to visit many of his old friends and new ones.










MEMORABLE QUOTES

"We have to learn so much about the subject of prayer, but not for the sake of cultivating my prayer life, showing the world how many hours a day I pray, what a pious guy I am because I pray and I'm in all those organisations for prayer and intercession, and standing in the gap and all that. But always in relation to reaching out to a lost world with the message of Jesus."

The difference between living and dying...

Can be as simple as "Somebody finds you in time." In time to share the Gospel with you.

God chose you and me to be His fellow workers...

"It's a mystery that God chooses us to be His fellow workers! Why should the Lord of the whole universe decide to entrust feeble people like you and me with participating in the unfolding of His will? We'll never be able to fathom it – but we need to believe it! God wants to use us to work out His purposes. What a privilege and a responsibility! So, let's get on our knees and pray. And may God use our prayers to change the course of history in these nations. For the sake of His people – and for His glory!"

To reach out to our persecutors...

"They're not our enemy, they're our mission field." He often said in relation to this, "We're not against any group or ideology. But rather, we're pro-Jesus and pro His Bride, the Church."
