ABOUT OPEN DOORS

It was back in 1955 that a young Dutch missionary went to Communist Poland with a suitcase full of Gospel tracts. Behind the Iron Curtain, he found isolated Christians who thought the world had forgotten them, and churches desperately in need of Bibles.

He prayed and opened his Bible – and found these words: "Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die." (Revelation 3:2)

That man became known as Brother Andrew, that verse became his mission – and his trip changed the world.

Brother Andrew made countless journeys across Europe in the following years, smuggling Bibles in his blue VW Beetle. He developed a trademark prayer:

"Lord, in my luggage I have Scripture I want to take to Your children. When You were on earth, You made blind eyes see. Now, I pray, make seeing eyes blind. Do not let the guards see those things You do not want them to see."

As the ministry grew, other needs emerged. As well as Bibles, persecuted Christians around the world needed leadership, education, and practical support.

Brother Andrew went to be with the Lord in 2022. But today, your support means Open Doors works in more than 70 countries to support Christians who dare to follow Jesus no matter the cost. With your gifts and prayers, millions of persecuted believers know they are not alone.

Thank you for standing with them.



AYUBA'S STORY

When Ayuba* heard Boko Haram were heading for his village in northeast Nigeria, he fled. He knew the violence inflicted by these Islamic extremists would be brutal.

The next day, Ayuba returned and discovered his father's body. He'd been beheaded. Then Boko Haram sent a list of people they wanted to kill next. "My name was on it," said Ayuba.

This young man immediately went into hiding. But your support found Ayuba – and you've given him a future.

You provided trauma counselling to address Ayuba's desire for revenge. You ensured he had the means to support his siblings. And you helped him join a vocational training course, leading to a good job.


"This training will help me in the future, and allow me to support the church," said Ayuba. "Thank you, my brothers and sisters, for your support. I pray God will bless you and your families."

YOUR IMPACT


FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH

In 2023, your prayers and support contributed to a total of **R22,5 million** that was granted by our Southern Africa base to our persecuted family across the world. That is an increase of around R2 million from the previous year. We praise the Lord for providing through His Church to His Church.

Here is how *you*, our Southern Africa partners, supported our persecuted family through different projects. You strengthened them, showing our persecuted family across the world that they are never alone.

IN AFRICA AND LATIN AMERICA

Our Southern Africa partners helped to raise a total of R488 875 for the region.

Violent persecution in Sub-Saharan Africa is unprecedented. In 2023, there were more killings, more attacks on Christian schools, clinics and churches, and a surge in believers forced to flee their homes.

Meanwhile, in Latin America, religious freedom violations are becoming more aggressive and frequent. Persecution is increasing faster in Nicaragua than almost anywhere else in the world.

You helped to reach believers under extreme pressure in Africa and Latin America.

The focus for Open Doors' work in Africa and Latin America in 2023 was socio-economic development, with more being spent in this area than any other.

Thanks to you, a number of "bridging projects" were launched. These strategic schemes demonstrate God's love for local people through projects that benefit the community. They include schools, mill houses, water boreholes and literacy classes. By building favour with the community, these projects challenge local perceptions of Christians and protect the church from harm.

Open Doors partners have come alongside believers with trauma counselling, relief and rehabilitation ministries.

In Latin America, 54 622 persecuted Christians were supported with training, mentoring, literature and advocacy work. Most support went to believers in Colombia, followed by Nicaragua.

EZANA AND FASIL'S STORY

Ezana and Fasil* longed for one thing: a safe childhood.


These young twins live in southern Ethiopia, where evangelical Christians are relentlessly persecuted. Their father is a bold preacher

– so the family is a target.

Ezana and Fasil attended a school supported by Open Doors, but it only went up to a certain age, and they were due to leave. They feared for their safety in a public school.

Thanks to you, their school has been expanded and more classes added. Now, the boys can stay on to learn and live out their faith in safety. "They are the next generation for the Gospel," said the twin's father Ermias*. "They are the hope for the Church."

DEEP DIVE INTO THE REGIONAL IMPACT

Our Southern Africa partners helped to raise a total of R911 109 for the region.

Asia is home to some of the most dangerous places on earth to follow Jesus.

In North Korea, believers face torture and death. In China, an estimated 10 000 churches were closed or destroyed in 2023. In India, the radical Hindu government has opened the door for a dramatic increase in violent persecution.

You helped to strengthen the Church in Asia as a powerful witness.



Supporting the Church in Asia to be salt and light was a key priority for 2023, with around two-thirds of all beneficiaries equipped to be witnesses for Christ. Your gifts provided discipleship materials, training, healing and church restoration projects.

Context-relevant training was run for 1 000 Christians in rural Laos, and leaders in North Korea were equipped with intensive discipleship training. According to feedback, in Sri Lanka, Bible training inspired three-quarters of Christians to display Christ-like behaviour, reaching out with love to their community.

Prayer gatherings were organised among mainstream churches in Malaysia and Indonesia to encourage people to pray with their persecuted brothers and sisters. Meanwhile, social media and online work reached 20% more people (including isolated believers) in Central Asia.

MING'S STORY

Ming* is part of China's underground Church. A Bible smuggler who has been rejected by his family and arrested by the authorities, he is under constant surveillance.

Recently, Ming's home was searched by the authorities again, and he narrowly avoided jail. Ming feels weary and distrustful – but your support strengthens his faith.

An Open Doors partner regularly meets with Ming to provide discipleship training and prepare him to lead an underground church in future.

Ming has this message for supporters like you: "Thank you for praying. I feel I am not by myself. I feel God has been looking after me, protecting me from being put in prison. You energise and encourage me to stay committed to the call of sharing the Gospel."

DEEP DIVE INTO THE REGIONAL IMPACT

IN THE MIDDLE EAST AND NORTH AFRICA

You, as part of our Southern Africa partners, contributed a total of R636 383 to support persecuted believers in the region.

Life is precarious and volatile for Christians in the Middle East and North Africa. Political turmoil and conflict have sparked an exodus of believers seeking security elsewhere. Natural disasters, including the huge earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, have added to the instability. Meanwhile, Believers from a Muslim Background in North Africa are under increasing pressure, and churches are being forcibly closed.

You helped to ensure persecuted believers are never alone.

Open Doors expanded its reach across the Middle East and North Africa, with humanitarian crises in places like Yemen opening up opportunities to connect with Christians. Our work grew in several North African nations as well as in Israel and Palestine, and our investment in social media has reached many isolated believers.

Your support also saw new church partners come on board. In Egypt alone, 3 144 churches were supported in places where Christians face intense persecution. Your gifts and prayers are helping churches shine as Centres of Hope, bringing God's love to communities under pressure.

We also saw fruit from Open Doors' longterm advocacy work. In one North African country (which we can't name for security reasons), we finally secured freedom for 14 brothers facing the death penalty. In another country, in the Middle East, detained believers were released.

YOUR SUPPORT IN ACTION

SAHAR'S STORY

Tears rolled down Sahar's* face as a car took her away from the family home. Her husband had discovered her secret faith and thrown her out. Would she see her children again?

Sahar went to prison in Iran for her faith. But today, she's safe in a neighbouring country, reunited with her sons. Because of your support, Sahar now helps other women risking everything to follow Jesus.

Sahar runs an online and in-person ministry reaching Iranian and Afghan women with the Gospel – with a special focus on women rejected by their families and communities.

"Christian women need prayer, love, counselling and teaching," said Sahar. "I do as much as I can. God gave me a vision, and thanks to you, I am pursuing it. Seeing God use me to bless others is very precious."

A TRAVELLER'S TESTIMONY

I had the privilege to join a trip to the Middle East. The Sunday, we attended a refugee church.

My friend who travelled with me said there is a lady and her son that I must pray for. The son is on dialysis and is very ill. It was as if a light switched on inside my soul. This was their request for prayer, but it was also my story. Twelve years ago, I was diagnosed with chronic kidney failure, was on dialysis and live to tell the tale after receiving a kidney transplant.

I met Marcia and her son, Michael, who is the same age as me. Immediately, we were talking like old friends. I could see how sick he was, and we spoke about his struggle with the dialysis and how he is unable to get a transplant because of his refugee status. We talked about our many shared experiences for a long time, prayed and cried together. It was a divine appointment that the Lord had been preparing me for 12 years, and now I could place this brother's burden with him before the Cross.

After our encounter, Romans 8:28 kept playing in my mind: "All things work together for those who love Him." I walked away humbled by the meeting that the Holy Spirit had in store for me halfway across the world and in awe of how He uses our past pain to encourage and give hope to fellow believers."

YOUR SUPPORT IN ACTION BETHANY'S STORY

It's hard to imagine the pain and sorrow endured by Bethany*. But thanks to you, she has a future...

Several years ago, Bethany's daughter Mary* was abducted by Fulani militants during an attack on their home in northern Nigeria. For 54 days, Mary was held captive and sexually assaulted. Bethany paid a ransom to secure Mary's release – but the payment left the family destitute.

Mary was traumatised by what happened. She attended an Open Doors healing programme – and things began to look brighter. "My daughter came back full of hope and love," remembers Bethany.

But tragedy struck again. Mary became ill, and in February 2023, she suddenly died.

It was hard to comprehend. "Just when I thought God was wiping my tears, I had the pain of losing Mary," said Bethany.

What happened next is a reminder of the extreme danger faced by Christians in sub-Saharan Africa, where violence is unprecedented, and believers risk everything to follow Jesus.

Just months after her daughter's death, Bethany herself was kidnapped while working in the fields. "I cried all day and night and prayed to God to rescue me," said Bethany. "All these events left me heartbroken and helpless."

Thankfully, you were there for Bethany.

Your support brought Bethany to an Open Doors trauma healing course after her release. "The one week I spent in the centre has brought joy, hope and reassurance of God's love," said Bethany. "It helped me know I am not alone."

And your kindness didn't end there. Thanks to you, Open Doors partners were able to build a house for Bethany on a small plot of land which belonged to Mary. Your generosity has given Bethany a new start – and hope for the future.

"My brethren in Christ, I am grateful to you all," said Bethany, tears rolling down her face. "You gave yourselves to do this for me. I lack the words to say thank you, but God will bless you."


Because of your faithfulness, secret believers found the fortitude to go on believing. Because of your faithfulness, our persecuted family's lives are being impacted in a positive manner.
