FEBRUARY

INDIA

1 February

Thousands of Christians in Manipur State remain displaced after the 2023 violence. Ask God to help these believers find permanent homes – and to give them hope.

2 February

Pray with your sister Kaveri* who was detained for leading a women's prayer group in her home. Her son was arrested for sharing the Gospel. Ask God to let them know He's ever close.

3 February

Pray that many women will be blessed and inspired by Kaveri's testimony, and that they will rise to live purposely for Christ.

4 February

Extremists continue to target Christians in India. Pray that

believers would be spared violence and ask God to comfort those who have suffered attacks.

SAUDI ARABIA

5 February

Although more than 2 million Christians live in Saudi Arabia, there are no legal public churches. Ask God to make a way for believers to find fellowship with one another.

6 February

Pray for parents. Raising Christian children in this country is very tough. Schools require students to take Islamic studies. Pray for wisdom for both parents and children.

7 February

Pray for single Christians, for opportunities to meet each other. Finding a significant other has been and continues to be a big challenge for Christians. Many long for marriage.

MYANMAR

8 February

The country's civil war continues, now in its fifth year. Christians are targeted and discriminated against by the ruling military junta. Pray for a change of heart in the authorities.

9 February

Ask God to protect church leaders and evangelists in Myanmar who risk their lives to bring God's Word and discipleship training to Christians in remote areas. Pray for their travels and for peace and comfort.

12 February

Since their house church was raided again last year, church leaders Lan* and her husband Qian* face intense pressure. "Please pray with us," Lan asks. "I do feel afraid at times."

CHINA

10 February

Youth under 18 are forbidden from attending church or religious gatherings. Pray for young believers and their parents that God would raise up a new generation of Chinese Christians who follow Jesus with passionate devotion.

11 February

Many believers in China worship in unregistered churches, knowing that at any

SYRIA

13 February

In the aftermath of the fall of the Assad regime, many Christians live with constant uncertainty. Pray that believers would lean on God as their "rock eternal" (Isaiah 26:4).

14 February

Pray with Judy, a graduate of the counselling school that Open Doors supports. "My counsellor helped me overcome this difficult time



after the war and earthquake. I wish to see this turning point for others.”

15 February

Pray for converts from Islam that they would find love and fellowship, even if family and friends reject them, and that they would feel God’s closeness as they decide how best to live out their faith.

COLOMBIA

16 February

Conflict again broke out as armed groups attacked each other. It’s a reminder that any peace in the country is tenuous. Ask God to bring about peace.

17 February

Pray that God would protect believers who find Jesus in indigenous communities. Pray they would be accepted rather than oppressed.

18 February

Christians in places ruled by drug gangs live at constant risk, often seen as threats to the cartels’ industries. Pray with them for their protection.

CAMEROON

19 February

Pray for the economic empowerment projects led by Open Doors partners in Cameroon. Pray that God would bless these efforts and use them to strengthen believers to follow Him, no matter what.

20 February

The Far North of Cameroon remains an incredibly dangerous place for Christians. Ask God to keep His people safe and protect them from Boko Haram raids.

21 February

Each week, Pastors Mamoud* and Hamza* go back to their former homes in the Far

| NICARAGUA

22 February

Pray with church leaders in Nicaragua; they can face arbitrary arrest and detention. Pray for strength for these leaders and their families.

23 February

Pray with your sister, Pastora*, and her husband, Roberto*. They were forced to flee the country. Pray that God would guide them with purpose in this new season, far from their home.

24 February

Ask God to protect Open Doors' partners as they seek to serve and strengthen the Nicaraguan Church. Pray that churches under surveillance

| ALGERIA

25 February

Nearly every Protestant church in Algeria has been forced to close or has suspended its services. Pray that Christians who have lost their place of worship will find fellowship.

26 February

Ask God to protect Christians who have left Islam. Conversion can be risky for both the person and anyone perceived to have shared the Gospel with the new convert.

27 February

Pray for Algerian believers forced to live their faith out in the shadows, like Kamelia*. She asks us to pray for insight, patience and faith, as her parents have begun to suspect her. "Everyone in my family prays the Muslim prayers except me."

28 February

Thank God for the brave, resilient faith of many believers in Algeria and throughout the world, who continue to walk with Jesus despite the risk.
